Calvary Christian School plans to extend our curriculum into the High School grades. Calvary Christian High School will offer Christ-centered Bible classes and cutting-edge curriculum connecting in-class and online students with caring, Christian teachers. These blended classes will unite full-time in-class students and full-time/part-time home-schooled students from across our local counties with other Christian and missionary students throughout the world.

In the area and immediate surrounding communities, there is no viable Christian High School or alternative except home schooling. The nearest Christian High Schools are located in Springfield, Marysville, Sidney, and Lima. Three schools are K-12 with less than 50 students. It is this void that Calvary Christian School wishes to fill.



Calvary Christian High School is an option for parents that are concerned about the world view their children are receiving. If a parent believes that their child needs a solid education based on the Word of God, there is currently no Christian school within easy commuting distance. Calvary has the unique opportunity to make this available to the community, a safe environment where a student can learn about the world around us, but from a Christian view. Calvary Christian High School will be a place where the students glorify God and individuals are taught to conform to Christ as they reach out to the lost.

Proposal

August 2012 Start Date

We will open the High School in August of 2012 with an initial enrollment of 10 students in the freshman class. We have conservatively projected the high school to double its enrollment by year three (3) of the school. The greatest operating expense will be the addition of staff during the first and third year. These expenses are projected to be covered by increases in enrollment.

Blended Classrooms

Calvary Christian High School will offer a blended learning experience with more “live” interaction between students and teacher. Classes in the school will run as a traditional classroom, but with state-of-the-art distance learning tools. Using video conferencing, off-site students participate in the same class, read from the same text, enter into the same discussion, complete the same homework, interact with the same classmates and ask questions to the same instructor, just as if they were present. Classroom materials are available online, homework can be submitted electronically, and teachers are available face-to-face during office hours. Video conferencing offers additional advantages. Classes will be recorded electronically and made available to absent students, whether they are offsite homeschoolers or full-time students at the high school.

And unlike our online competition, our teachers are not impersonal recipients of an email, hundreds of miles away, but caring, members of our own community, willing to meet face to face with their students.

The Curriculum

Our Christian curriculum is based on Ohio requirements for graduation and surrounding public school

offerings. We attempted to mimic the neighboring schools as closely as possible in order to allow a smooth transition for students coming from the public system. In addition, we require a credit of Bible for each year the student is enrolled in Calvary.

During the summer of 2012, we will hire a new teacher. This teacher will have a math-science background at the high school level.

In order to utilize this teacher for both the freshman and sophomore years, the schedule will alternate the core curriculum each year. For example, during the year 2012-13 we will be teaching Physical Science to all freshman and sophomores. During the year 2013-14, we will be teaching Biology to all freshman and sophomores. This will allow us to teach the same curriculum to two different levels of students at the same time. Sample schedules are included with the FAQ handout to show a possible scenario.

Our Leadership

The Calvary Christian School Board is pleased to announce that Mr. Paul Green will be the new administrator for the School. Mr. Green comes to us with 40 years of education experience and most of that experience was gained in Logan County. Mr. and Mrs. Green have been long time supporters of CCS. Mr. Green has an administrator and counselor certification with the state of Ohio. Paul, presently a guidance counselor at Waynesfield-Goshen Local Schools, will assume duties this summer after the conclusion of the school year.
